# Presentation: The Self-Assessment Workbook (SAW) Tool

- We learned about and discussed the SAW Tool, a framework for evaluating our network created by the Alliance to End Hunger
- Thoughts:
  - Financial Management adds structure to a network
  - Resource sharing is essential
    - Referring clients between member organizations
    - Sharing events and services
  - Strategic Planning is best done as a group
    - Creates buy-in and a shared sense of ownership

### **Presentation: NFPN Historical Highlights**

- We discussed what has worked and what hasn't worked
- Four main areas:
  - Strategy
    - Strategic Plan 2016 2017 focused on Events, Outreach, and Capacity
  - Fundraising/Foodraising
    - Requested specialty food and household items
    - Foodraising has been more successful than fundraising
    - "Eat for a Cause" events were not very lucrative
  - Outreach/Communications
    - Need for more resource sharing between member organizations
      - We all have resources and opportunities which other members aren't aware of
    - We could attend more tabling opportunities
  - Capacity Building
    - Could have workshops/trainings at future meetings or as separate events

#### **Ideas**

- Topic: Fundraising, Foodraising, and Item Drives
  - Can Opener Drive
    - Could receive can openers as donations and/or purchase can openers in bulk
    - Could ask Alderman to buy them in bulk
    - Greater Chicago Food Depository could possibly purchase them, too
    - P38 Can Opener



- \$0.49 each on Army Surplus World
- 500 for \$198 (or \$0.396 each) on Amazon
- Ask local restaurants to have proceeds from an appetizer, cocktail, etc. go to NFPN
- Could receive donations from real estate brokers
- Holiday Food Drive
  - Grocery stores and large organizations very receptive to helping
  - Other potential partners:
    - Hospitals
    - Greek life
- Topic: Communications and Outreach
  - Digital forum on NFPN website or Listserv
    - Could share resources, alerts, events, etc.
  - Family Friendly Events
    - Adults could have fun, children would be cared for
  - Table at more fairs
  - o Prepare marketing materials for all NFPN members to use
  - Weekly newsletter sharing member announcements and resources
- Topic: Capacity Building
  - Another retreat
  - Finish revised Strategic Plan
